A CITYarts mural project in The Bronx, New York

What:

CITYarts has produced and created a mural on the Shakespeare Stairs in the Bronx. After this staircase was featured in the Joker film, the site saw an influx of tourists. CITYarts and the community reclaimed the site as the Shakespeare Stairs. The community will feel ownership of both the stairs and the mural. This project has been created in collaboration with the City Council Member's office, local schools, youth, community, two professional artists, artist assistants, volunteers, and residents. This program was supported, in part, by public funds from the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs in partnership with the City Council. This project will be adopted by the Highbridge Green School located across from the mural as our Shakespeare Stairs Keepers.
